Jonathan Bland, Managing Director, Social Business International: Jonathan is an international expert on social enterprise with 30 years' experience working in this field. Since 1998 he has been a leader in the UK social enterprise movement, bringing together a diverse range of people and organisations under the umbrella of social enterprise.

Henry Stewart, Founder, CEO and Chief Happiness Officer, Happy: Founded as Happy Computers in Henry's back room in Hackney back in 1987, Happy Computers developed quite a reputation, rated one of the top 20 workplaces in the UK for five successive years. Since 2003, Happy has developed a range of management and leadership programmes, and helps other organisations create happy workplaces.

Liz Mouland, Chief Nurse & Director of Clinical Standards, First Community Health & Care CIC: After training as a Registered Nurse at Guy's Hospital London, Liz moved into community nursing, working in a variety of clinical and HEI roles. In 2009, together with colleague Val Frost, Liz formed part of a staff 'Right to Request' under the Transforming Community Services agenda, successfully creating First Community, a social enterprise community interest company providing NHS community services in east Surrey and parts of West Sussex, and employing over 460 staff. Liz now leads on patient safety, quality and experience.

Brendan O'Keefe, Managing Director, Epic CIC: Brendan is the Managing Director of Epic CIC, the UK's first youth service mutual launched in January 2014. He is a Cabinet Office Mutuals Ambassador and advises local authorities throughout the country on the mutualisation of services. He has hands-on experience of leading a successful public sector spin out and holds a Masters Degree in Social Policy and Administration from the London School of Economics. Brendan is driven by the notion that supporting young people to make a successful transition to responsible and fulfilling adulthood is one of the most important duties of any modern day society.

Scott Darraugh, Chief Executive, Social adVentures: In 2010 Scott became Chief Executive of Social adVentures, after leading his team of public health specialists out of the NHS in Salford to create one of the country's first NHS public service mutuals. A wellbeing social enterprise with the aim of inspiring people to lead healthy and happy lives, Social adVentures won the RBS SE100 Index 'Growth Champion' Award in 2012, having achieved a 262% growth in annual turnover. In 2013 Scott became a Mutuals Ambassador, working with the cabinet office to shape policies encouraging the development of mutuals delivering public services. A specific area of focus is the development of innovative financial products to address the specific needs of the mutuals sector to support further growth.

June O'Sullivan MBE, Chief Executive, London Early Years Foundation: LEYF is the UK's leading childcare charity and social enterprise, running 37 nurseries across 11 London boroughs. As creator and CEO since 2006, June continues to break new ground in the development of LEYF's scalable social business model and is a tireless campaigner, looking for new ways to influence policy and make society a better place for all children and families. A champion of community-based, multi-generational early years education as the basis for greater social and cultural capital to deliver long-term social impact, June advises Governments, as well as a range of organisations, academics and services at home and overseas, about how best to implement a social enterprise vision for Early Years.
